



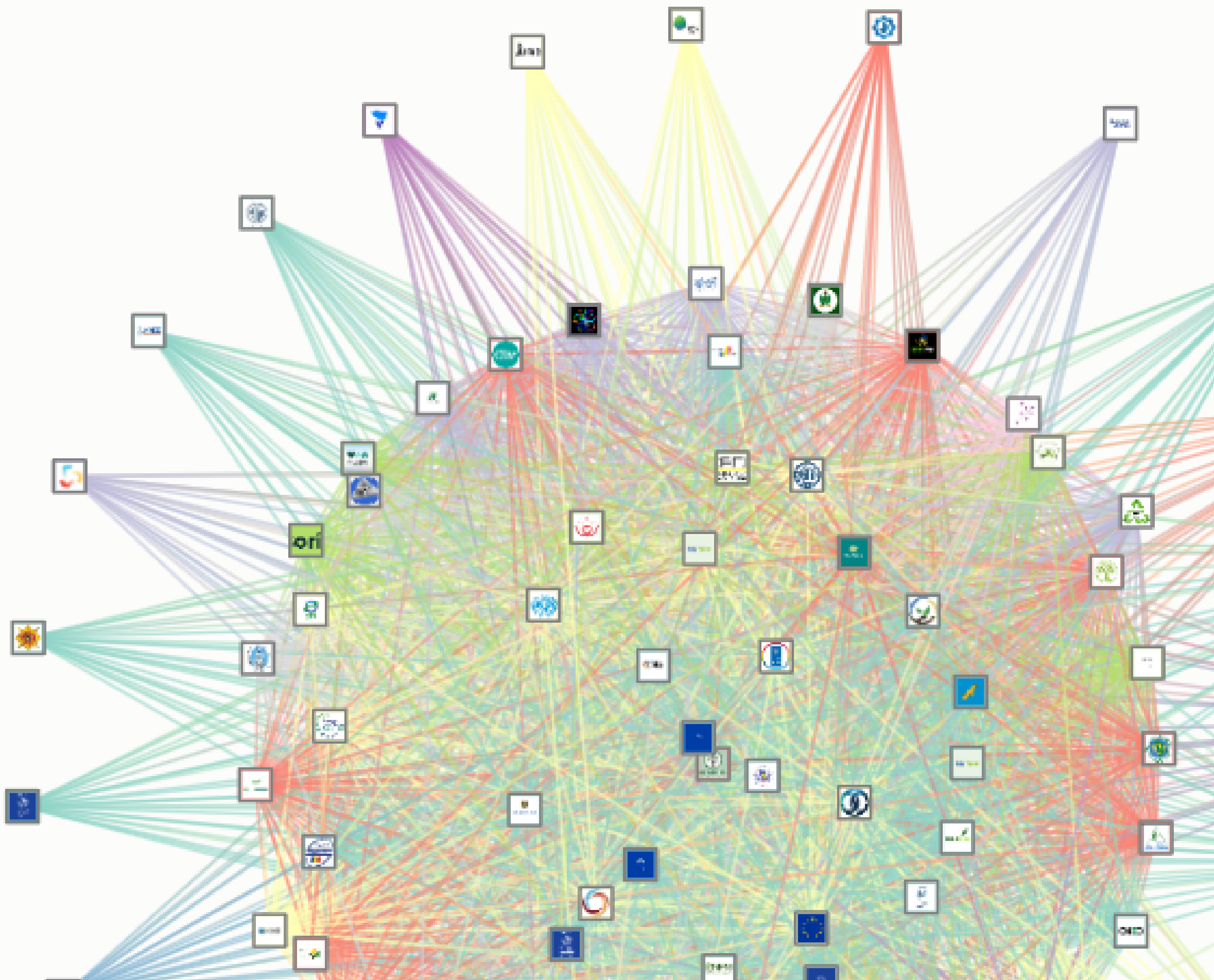

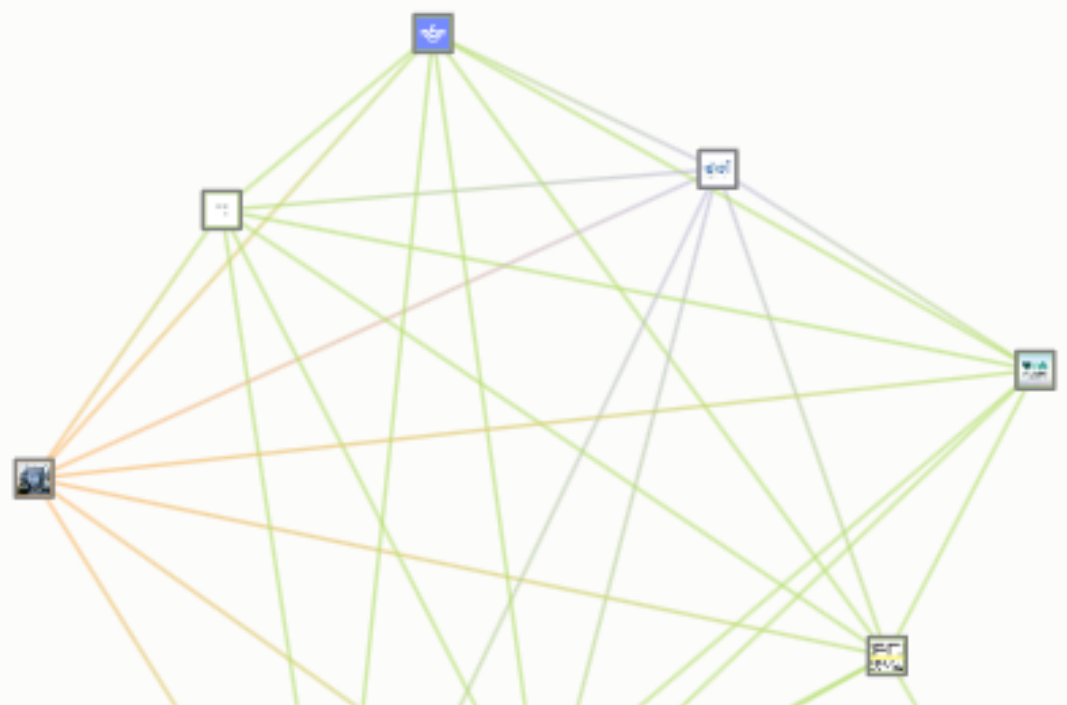
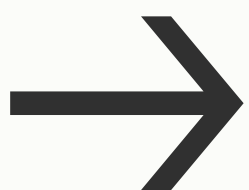


A MAPPING OF THE ECOSYSTEM

The stakeholder map covers 86 institutions and shows who is active in Moldova's Circular Economy ecosystem, and how public institutions, support organisations and business actors are connected.

It offers a way to read the landscape:

- Who helps shape the system?
- Who supports implementation?
- And where might cooperation be easier to start?



WHERE THE SYSTEM CAN MOVE

Circular economy is not only about recycling. It also depends on regulation, infrastructure, partnerships and implementation.

For anyone interested in Moldova, understanding the ecosystem can be a practical first step to identify partners and see where the system is already stronger – and where bottlenecks remain.



WHAT THE MAPPING REVEALS

The mapping shows that circular economy in Moldova is currently driven mainly by public institutions and international support.

Packaging and construction are more advanced. Collection in batteries and vehicles exists, but repair, refurbishment and component recovery remain weak. Similarly, only a limited share of e-waste appears to enter formal collection channels.



EXAMPLES OF ACTORS

The landscape includes public institutions, environmental bodies and support actors that help shape circular economy in Moldova, such as:

- e-Circular



EXPLORE THE NETWORK

The map visualizes Moldova's circular economy landscape. In some areas, collection may exist but further recovery steps remain weak. For anyone looking at Moldova, that provides a more practical picture of where cooperation and implementation may be easier – and where bottlenecks remain.
